
Welcome to a region where we have made it happen. In the Region of Murcia there are attractions for both children and adults, fun for the whole family and all kinds of plans.

As you pass through the region of Murcia, you will enjoy the views of the sea in the area of Águilas and Lomo Bas, the unforgettable experience of walking a path parallel to the sea in Bolnuevo in Mazarrón, the sensation of riding next to the Mar Menor, the safety of the bike lanes of San Javier or San Pedro del Pinatar, where you can contemplate its salt flats and sandbanks, kilometres bordering beaches, go to a full mountain environment going up the Garruchal, or enter different sections of green roads, riding without traffic and in quiet dirt paths, between trees and native vegetation. And all this, with the essence of the EuroVelo network, promoting sustainable tourism through cycling, in a comfortable, safe and environmentally friendly way.


I.5 SAN JAV:ER




I.6 LOS ALGÁZARES




The route of the giants... or the mills?



2.3 CARTACENA



To the conquest of Carthago Nova

The great characters in the history of Cartagena come to meet you from every corner in the theatrical visits to show the rich legacy of the civilizations that landed in this port and reveal its secrets, legends and incredible stories. Listen carefully!

A complete family route through the Roman Theatre, the Roman Forum neighbourhood, the House of Fortune, the Augusteum and tour the walls of Concepción Medieval Castle to spot enemy ships and learn to handle a cannon like a soldier from the XIX century in the Christmas Fort, which you can reach on the tourist boat and see the Castles, coastal batteries, lighthouses and docks from the water.

The Naval Museum is another really interesting stop. The exhibitions on navigation and shipbuilding and the Isaac Peral room stand out, where you can see the submarine that for more than 80 years has been a symbol of the port city.

Would you like to get lost in the largest plant labyrinth in the world? It is an interactive labyrinth with twelve doors that allow us to configure the route at our will, to which are joined the two itineraries, one easy, and another more complicated for those who love challenges. Will you be able to find the way out? But this is not all, because it has multi-adventure circuits, green areas for leisure, sports, recreation and recreation. It also has Aquaventura, an aquatic complex with three large pools and slides, and a twelve-metre-long pirate ship. Buccaneers, aboard!


A great miniature museum





The prehistoric Michelangelo's cave

In the shelter of the Los Almadenes Canyon, countless chasms and caves of enormous natural and cultural value are hidden. The Sima de la Serreta is one of the most unique sites in the Region. This cave is open to the impressive Almadenes Canyon, with walls that in some points reach 120 m. high above the river, this incredible cavity was a Neolithic habitat with more than 50 paintings, which are considered a World Heritage Site for their good state of conservation and uniqueness.

Is it a river or is it a beach?

A pleasant walk along the river beach of El Arenal takes us to the Miguelico Núñez Ferris Wheel, and ends at the Museum and Interpretation Centre of Light and Water. The young and not so young will learn the operation and use of water as motive energy. Did you know that Blanca was the first municipality with electric public lighting in the Region of Murcia?











3.3 SIERRA ESPUÑA

Murcia's Jurassic Park

A good way to introduce children to the natural values of the Sierra Espuña Regional Park is through the dinosaur trail. A tour that leads through magical corners and spectacular views. The rock with a footprint that looks like a dinosaur and that gives its name to the path is located very close to a suspension bridge. And to learn in depth about the environmental wealth of Sierra Espuña, the Ricardo Codorniú Visitor Centre with interesting panels, models and interactive elements.

Where snow never melts

In Sierra Espuña there is a place where the snow does not melt in summer, the snow wells. They are structures from the XVI century and served as refrigerators to preserve winter snow. They are located at more than 1000 metres above sea level, to where village workers had to climb to store snow. Among the many points of interest in this Regional Park you will find the recreational areas of Hilo y la Perdiz, Leiva Valley and Carrasca Log Home.

A fun eco experience

Learn to work wicker, become a baker for a day or experiment with medicinal plants. Immerse yourself in a unique experience in which you will discover as a family the charm of traditional techniques that, even if the years pass, never cease to amaze us. You can also discover secret hiking routes with a guide, such as the Via Ferrata Barranco del Ciervo. Become a scientist by starting caving or adventure with orienteering games. Remember to book in advance!

ALCANTARILLA

What is the life of the orchardists like?

An open-air museum with a representation of the Murcian Huerta, with irrigation ditches, a water wheel and an aqueduct to learn about the history of our orchard, its missing trades, professions and customs. In addition, it has a huge area with leisure spaces.





TOTANA

Have we found Troy?

La Bastida is the most important archaeological site known from the Argaric culture. Check out what the utensils of the time were like through the finds of copper, bronze, silver, stone, bone and ceramics. You will surely be surprised by the imposing fortification that has given the town the nickname of the Troy of the West. Although the famous wooden horse is missing, there are plenty of stories to tell.

The magical shapes of clay

You are in the land of pottery and ceramic crafts. A deep-rooted activity that has left its mark on traditional Arab ovens. Visiting a pottery workshop is entering a magical world where you can create clay objects. Would you like to try it? In addition to the potter's demonstrations, you can participate in workshops on this ancient craft.

MULA

Who was living better, us or the Romans?

The Roman Villa of Villaricos had a thermal area, domestic spaces and work areas where oil and wine were made. In fact, this town houses the largest excavated oil mill in Spain. Discovering the customs of Hispania through the remains of this Roman villa will be even more fun than history class at school.

Just 10 kilometres from the centre of Mula you can enjoy with your family a small oasis that preserves Roman sites related to the use of water: the Fuente Caputa spring. Its name comes from the Latin "caput" which means collection or storage. It's always a good time to learn something new. Isn't it?

Estrecho de la Arboleja

From here you can take an excursion to the Estrecho de la Arboleja. Emblematic natural space formed by a small "canyon" that for thousands of years the water has been sculpting on the limestone rock that houses small water sources and small lagoons, turning this place into a natural paradiseof unmatched beauty.

If you like birds, you cannot miss visiting the Campotéjar Lagoons, an important wetland where several species of waterfowl spend the winter, and it has a visitor centre that organizes family activities throughout the year.







We recommend that you enter the dungeons of Jumilla Castle, cross its central patio and walk through the supply room, the warden's room and the troops' room, upon reaching the viewpoint. Before you, a landscape among vineyards touched by fairies.
